Home Tour 2022 Back in Person Village Takes Cake with 5th Tour

Waterfront Village will hold its annual home tour, Homes of the Southwest Waterfront, on Sunday, October 16, from 1:00 p.m.– 5:00 p.m. This will be the fifth anniversary year for the tour and the first conducted as a self-guided walking tour since 2019.

"We are so pleased to return to a walking format. It creates a festive spirit across the whole neighborhood," said Carrol Quinn, the Village's president.

The house tour, supported by local businesses and organizations, will showcase the hidden residential gems of Southwest DC. The tour highlights the history and diversity of the community. According to Quinn, the houses, apartments, churches and commercial buildings in the area are a tribute to the architecture and styles of the past few centuries, and a walk through the neighborhood is a history lesson.

This year, the tour will feature both existing and newly finished homes, underscoring the dynamic mix of old and new in Southwest DC. Among the properties featured will be a townhouse from historic Wheat Row and a penthouse condominium from the Wharf.

Noting the significance of the fifth consecutive year of the tour, Village Executive Director Len Bechtel said that the tour is now very well established and is something that many neighborhood residents look forward to seeing throughout the year.

"There are just a few community events that capture the hearts and imaginations of local residents every year: the cherry blossoms in spring, fireworks on the Fourth, and the Waterfront Village home tour in the fall. We know people are counting on us for a good show," he said. Proceeds from the home tour will support the Village's programming and services for older adults in Southwest DC and the Navy Yard. Saint Augustine's Episcopal Church at 555 Water Street SW will serve as the registration site where Tour participants will pick up walking maps and ID bracelets.

Ticket costs for the tour are \$20 prior to October 16 and \$25 on tour-day Sunday. Tour participants must be 13 or older, and no dogs are permitted in the homes.
