Village Expands Senior Citizens Day to a Week

For the second consecutive year, Waterfront Village will celebrate National Senior Citizens Day with a full week of special activities from August 21-25. Events will include the Village annual peach festival, a concert, a museum visit, a restaurant night out, and a presentation by a popular local journalist.

"One day is not enough time to honor our senior citizens, so we took the full week," said Pam Troutman, assistant director for membership. "We have designed a week that is fun, informative and culturally relevant. We should have a great time."

The history of National Senior Citizen's Day dates back to 1988. President Ronald Reagan realized the importance of older adults in society and decided to honor them. He signed Presidential Proclamation 5847 and declared August 21 as National Senior Citizens Day.



The celebration took place for the first time in 1991 in the United States. This day intends to increase awareness of the issues impacting older adults. It is a day designated for honoring and supporting older family and community members and recognizing their achievements and contributions.




Village Visits DC Central Kitchen Cafe

Village Home Tour Tickets Now on Sale





Circuit Transporation Update

Village members have reported overwhelmingly positive experiences with the Circuit. This electric vehicle-based transportation service operates within Southwest DC.

We would like to offer an important navigation tip when using the Circuit. If you are requesting a ride down to the Buzzards Point area of SW, you can only request a ride via



the app by using an **address on 2nd Street**. If you view the Circuit map, picutured to the right, you can see that the area covered towards Buzzards Point is only up and down 2nd Street. Several members have experienced some challenge when attempting to request a ride using their location when they are just off of 2nd Street.

If you use a 2nd Street address, for example, 2100 2nd Street (The Point Restaurant), then you can hop on or off there and may have to walk a few steps to your destination.
